Year-over-Year Comparison

2024-2025 ↔ 2025-2026 · Change by faculty and department

The overall success rate rose from **56.8%** to **64.5%** in a single year – a **7.7-point** gain. The number advancing to year 1 rose by 50 and the number unsuccessful fell by 61; non-attendance, however, edged up slightly.

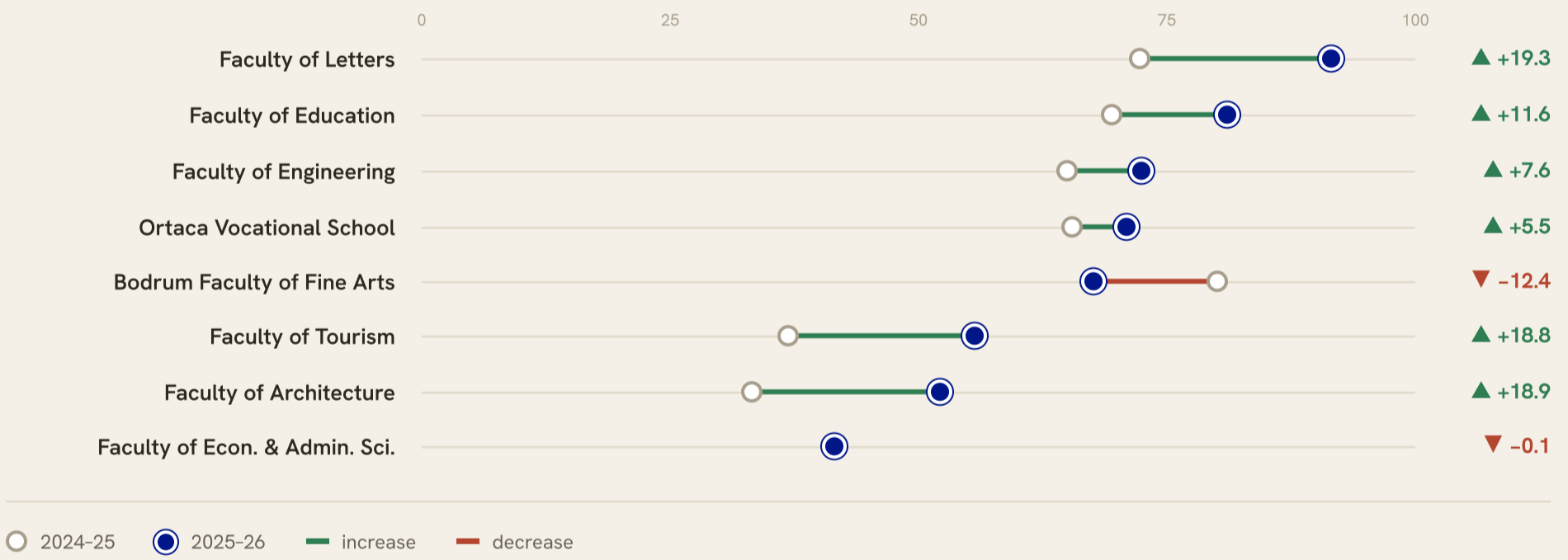
Six of eight faculties improved their success rate. The largest gains were at the **Faculty of Letters** (+19.3 pts), **Architecture** (+18.9 pts) and **Tourism** (+18.8 pts); the only notable decline was at **Bodrum Fine Arts** (-12.4 pts).

Faculty of Medicine

Present only in 2024-25 (25 students, 100% success). Not included in the 2025-26 table.

Change in program type

In 2024-25 a **Turkish Preparatory** program (52 students) was also assessed; in 2025-26 an **Optional Preparatory** program (65 students) was assessed instead.

Non-attendance trend

Overall non-attendance rose from 192 to 222 students (19.7% → 22.4%). Monitoring participation is recommended.
