

SPEAKING EXAM

You need your student card with you!!!

The speaking exam has three parts:

- Conversation
- Picture description
- Monologue question

Each part is evaluated separately (conversation 4 points, picture description 4 points, monologue 4 points)

In total, you get a maximum of 15 points- 12 points from an assessor and 3 points from an interlocutor

CONVERSATION:

The topics for the conversation are from everyday life (daily routine, hobbies, your hometown, your plans, your department, family, free time, etc). You are graded on your ability to understand and respond to a question and follow-up questions.

- It is a dialogue between the teacher and the student (asking & answering questions)
- 1-2 minutes

PICTURE DESCRIPTION

You are asked to describe a picture that on a speaking exam card.

You can start with general information, continue with details. and make guesses with reasons for your opinions.

You can describe the **place**: Where is the photo from? Where was it taken?

Location of objects- What is where?

People: age, job, physical description, clothes, roles, feelings, character,..

Action: What are they doing? (using present continuous)

Your opinion and experience/related memories

- 1-2 minutes

MONOLOGUE

You are given a monologue question/topic to talk about.

You have a short time before you start talking to brainstorm and write notes, if necessary. Once you are ready, you talk about your chosen topic for about 2 minutes. The teacher will not ask you any questions. Teachers may reword questions to assist with understanding or encourage speech.
